Sponsorship of a Ugandan Child to Attend School

Working with All Saints Church of England School, we will be holing a fundraiser in January 2024 to jointly sponsor a child through school. Each school will contribute £120 each annually going forward (but there will be an increase based upon inflation). This is a long term commitment for both schools. We will raise our contribution through an ice-cream sale in January 2024.

Since the beginning of January 2014 a great deal of



hard work has been undertaken by a group of local people in Bedford, England who are passionately committed to offering a better life to desperately poor and orphaned children in southern Uganda. This has been a response to the work of Father Boniface Kaayabula, a Ugandan priest, who since 1997 has been seeking to offer a better future to some of the poorest children in the world. They now outreach to Catholic parishes to join them. In turn, we have reached out to All Saints School to share a child's sponsorship.
