


PTA News



Leo is a member of the Newmarket Swim Club. He swims with them 4 times a week for an hour. He is the youngest swimmer in the club and as only under 9 years old he wasn't allowed to compete for a long time after joining the club.

Leo turned 9 in April and just as the half term started (26th of May), he took part in his first swimming competition at the Fenland Open Meet (Whittlesey). He swam 50m of butterfly, backstroke, breaststroke and freestyle and also 100m Individual Medley. In total, he swam 5 races and won 5 medals! (4 slivers and 1 bronze).

Leo also received a trophy as a Top Male in his 9 years group category! This is Leo taken after the competition. His times were great, so also gained three county times. 


This year we invested more than £4,000 in new reading books using a book subsidy scheme. We have a diverse range of class readers for all years.


We are keen to recruit to open the library for families before or after school. Sadly, our volunteer moved back to USA.
