Dear Parents and Carers

It has been lovely to welcome all the children back to the Spring Term after a very busy Autumn one.

Thank you to all the families who supported the Advent Fair and especially those who organised such a well attended and successful event. Thanks to the teachers for leading the Nativity in our hall and at church and for the wonderful Carol Service led in church.

Spring term promises to be equally busy with children continuing to study towards their SATs tests at the end of KS1 and KS2. Please support your children to return their homework on time and we remain grateful to you all for home learning support. Time for times tables practice and reading are much needed.

The parent survey ends soon and helps us to adapt and respond to your ideas to improve the school and we will report on this in the March newsletter once it is reported to Governors. Please take a few minutes to complete this survey if it is on your 'to do' list.

Changes to school this term include the completing of the school teaching kitchen in January, works towards the replacement of an oil fired boiler with an air source heat pump and selection of a specialist company to repair the crumbling boundary wall. We hope to order the outdoor mini gym for the playground that replaces the congo climbing frame. The Diocese are supporting the development of the wellbeing hub beside the library and I am told that subject to planning approval, this could be on site over the Summer holidays.

Our second face to face parent consultation meetings for the year take place in the Spring Term but if you need to chat to your teacher, you can make an appointment through the school office.

If you have a few hours to spare on a regular basis, can you help us with reading with children, running the school library or helping in other ways?

Live Theatre for Year 5

Following two hugely successful years, Theatre Royal will again work with a team of professional playwrights to teach 450 pupils from 12 West Suffolk Primary schools, to write their first play. A play from each school will be

performed at Theatre Royal, by a team of professional actors, to children (the writers) and their teachers. Children will take part in high quality workshops, led by East Anglian playwrights, teaching the essential skills of playwriting, enabling children to creatively express themselves and to see their thoughts and ideas brought to life on the stage.

As a school working towards Artsmark Silver Accreditation in Summer Term, we gain many opportunities and priority spaces on writing experiences. We have secured spaces for all Year 5's to work in school with scriptwriters to develop Tiny Plays that will then be performed by professional actors at the Theatre Royal in Bury St Edmunds. We will take them to the theatre to see how their writing translates into live stage performance. This supports their Skillsbuilder Skills of Aiming High, Teamwork, Speaking and Listening. Over the past two years, the children's writing skills have been enriched by these experiences.




