**Dear Parents and Carers** 



We had a busy and productive Spring Term of learning, despite the increased incidence of Covid amongst our staff as we approached

Easter. Everyone was wonderful in stepping in to support each other and we kept things going. I am yet again indebted to all the staff for their ongoing commitment and hard work in caring for the St Louis children.

This month a letter arrived from the Trustees working on behalf of the Sisters of St Louis and it informed me that the Sisters have gifted St Louis Catholic Academy £100,000 to be invested in a wellbeing hub where we can support children and their families. We have many families and children that need extra help and struggle to find a calm and private area to provide this support. Whilst we have mental health first aiders, drawing and talking therapists, family support workers, speech and language therapists and other health professionals meeting in school, we need some dedicated space to deliver services from. Over the coming months, I will work with the Diocese, who are the custodians of the legacy, to develop a proposal for creating a new small space to spend time supporting children and families. We will need to carefully negotiate planning consents because we are within a Newmarket Conservation area. Meanwhile, I anticipate contactors will be on site towards the end of May to fit our new teaching kitchen. This will create a wonderful facility for learning and a space for children to cook with their families. Hopefully, we'll be able to access some nutrition-focused workshops once we have the dedicated space.

Our Year 6 and Year 2 children will be sitting their SATs tests shortly. Despite interruptions to school life over the past two years, we know they all work so hard and we wish them well in these assessments. Please ensure your children get plenty of sleep to be at their most energetic and alert. Please contact me by email on sueblakeley@stlouisacademy.co.uk with any queries.

#### Welcome to Reception!

Your child's first step into full time education at St Louis Catholic Academy. We welcome the children full time from September with open arms and big smiles. During the initial weeks of the Autumn term we focus on settling the children into their new environment and getting to know them and you, their family. The children soon settle and this supports their Personal, Social and Emotional development. We pride ourselves on achieving a good balance of adult-led teaching, especially for Literacy, Maths and R.E, but also recognise that children learn best through their play. Therefore, we observe the children in their chosen activity and come alongside them to support and extend their learning in the moment, enhancing the continuous provision to further support teaching and learning.

Alongside learning in the moment, we have our overarching learning theme each term. For example, the children have been scientists and learnt about lifecycles by watching chicks hatch and grow and caterpillars creating a cocoon and finally emerging as a butterfly that we have released into the prayer garden. We have visitors into school for our 'People who help us' theme and have visited a wildlife park to support teaching and learning about animals.

A key area of learning for Reception children during their year with us, is Communication and Language. We teach the children how to be a good listener and an effective speaker with others one -to-one, in small groups and as part of a whole class. A life skill that will support their learning throughout their time at St Louis and beyond.

We are very lucky to have some wonderful outdoor spaces for the children to explore and develop their physical skills, strength and co-ordination. The Pirate Ship area is probably one of the children's favourite areas. They engage in imaginative play, dig in the sand and develop their strength and agility on the monkey bars and other equipment. In addition to this, the children take part in weekly PE lessons provided by specialist PE teachers. During the year they study games, dance and gym. The children also benefit from outdoor learning during regular Forest School sessions, led by a specialist Forest School leader. So much fun to be had while developing their gross and fine motor skills!

We feel very privileged to be part of laying the foundations for your child's reading and writing journey. We follow the Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised phonics programme. This teaches the children letter sounds and names, common exception words (tricky words) and teaches reading comprehension. As part of our literacy lessons, we also teach correct letter formation to develop children's writing skills.

The Catholic faith of our school runs through our early years practice. The children learn how to grow like Jesus in their thoughts and actions. They are very good at looking out for each other and helping others. We celebrate special events throughout the year in the Church calendar as well as learning about other faiths and cultures by coming together with others. The children attend Mass, liturgies and assemblies, learning a range of prayers and hymns to further enhance their Religious Education.

We hold regular Stay and Play sessions for our Reception parents so if you have not been able to attend any so far please ask Mrs Baldwin or Mrs Smith when future sessions are so you can come and join in with your child's learning.

#### Are you eligible for Free School Meals?

You might be eligible for free school meals. Free school meals also means that your child is prioritised for after school and free holiday clubs. School also receives extra funding to help in school. We are able to help you to make the application if you think that you may be interested? Free school meals also mean that we can issue food vouchers to you in holiday periods.

Your child will get free school meals if you receive any of the following:

Income Support, Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance, Income-related **Employment and Support Allowance** 



Guarantee element of State Pension Credit, Child Tax Credit but no element of Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenues & Customs) that does not exceed £16,190, If you are supported under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999, Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after your employment finishes or after you start to work fewer hours per week, Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400 (£616.67 per month), as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).

#### **Big Bedtime Read**


Within our school, there is a great focus on providing a rich and stimulating environment, in which children are immersed in oral language and books. Staff invest a lot of time in developing a love of stories, and on introducing children to a range of information books. They skillfully develop children's concept of print throughout the day incorporating text into different areas of learning.

Mrs White is keen to encourage everyone to read to their child at bedtime and she is hosting a Big Bedtime Read to help raise awareness of the importance of reading to children. Establishing good bedtime routines that include a story book are important in showing children that their family values reading for pleasure. Mrs White invites you to come back to school on 23rd June at 5.3opm to enjoy a free pizza supper for families followed by a bedtime read.

#### Little Wandle Phonics

In Summer term, Reception children will begin using Little Wandle teaching of phonics. We have selected the Government validated scheme because we believe that it provides school with a synthetics phonics programme that will support all of our children to read successfully. The resources on Little Wandle website will help families and carers to support their child with saying their sounds and writing their letters. There are also some useful videos so you can see how they are taught at school and feel confident about supporting their reading at home. F

From September, all KS1 will be using the Little Wandle teaching programme.

We are making the change because all schools have been asked to use one of the Government validated programmes. Reception and KS1 teachers worked with Mrs. White, English Leader, to select Little Wandle from a shortlist. In selecting Little Wandle, we are investing in new books and resources and teachers are have received extensive training.

Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised is a complete systematic synthetic phonics programme (SSP) developed for schools by schools. Based on the original Letters and Sounds, but extensively revised to provide a complete teaching programme meeting all the expectations of the National Curriculum and preparing your children to go beyond the expectations of the Phonics Screening Check.

#### Supporting your child with reading

Although your child will be taught to read at school, you can have a huge impact on their reading journey by continuing their practice at home. There are two types of reading book that your child may bring home:

A reading practice book. This will be at the correct phonic stage for your child. They should be able to read this fluently and independently:

A sharing book. Your child will not be able to read this on their own. This book is for you both to read and enjoy together.

#### Reading practice book

This book has been carefully matched to your child's current reading level. If your child is reading it with little help, please don't worry that it's too easy – your child needs to develop fluency and confidence in reading.

Listen to them read the book. Remember to give them lots of praise – celebrate their success! If they can't read a word, read it to them. After they have finished, talk about the book together.

#### **Sharing book**

In order to encourage your child to become a lifelong reader, it is important that they learn to read for pleasure. The sharing book is a book they have chosen for you to enjoy together.

Please remember that you shouldn't expect your child to read this alone. Read it to or with them. Discuss the pictures, enjoy the story, predict what might happen next, use different voices for the characters, explore the facts in a non-fiction book. The main thing is that you have fun!

Nursery, Reception and KS1 classes will watch a performance of Party by Half Moon Theatre


