We have recently been informed that there has been an error with the registration system (now resolved) that means some entrants were unable to enter contact details, and have therefore not received their final race details. We can only apologise on their behalf. To ensure all of the entrants have the information, I attached the final race details and instructions on page 2 of this communication.

Children must be over the age of 4 on the day of the run and all children under the age of 8 must be accompanied on the run by a parent or guardian. Parents/guardians are not required to register to accompany children participating and will not be issued with a run number or receive a medal. Older children can also run with parents, but this is not a requirement.

The race will be held at Ipswich Town Football Club, Portman Road, IP1 2DA.

There is no onsite car park, you are asked to use the surrounding public car parks and adhere to their terms and conditions when doing so.

Race numbers will be available at the venue from 6pm on the day. The bib contains a race chip, please do not bend it and please ensure the emergency details are completed on the back of the blb.

There is a baggage area available, it will be staffed but items are left at your own risk.

The Daily Mile Wave will start at 6:30pm on Constantine Road. It is a 2K course and finishes on the Ipswich Town Football Club ground.

Headphones and music are not permitted during the run for safety reasons.

Water will be available for participants at the end, along with medals for the children.

By taking part, the race organisers assume that is an indication that you consider yourself/your child fit and healthy enough to participate and that you will not hold them responsible for illness or injury. The course and event have been risk assessed to ensure your safety.

If you need medical assistance, please let a marshal or race official know so that qualified aiders are called to assist.

There will be toilets available on the grounds throughout.

Free School Meals

Your child will get free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support, Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance, Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit but **no element of Working Tax Credit** and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenues & Customs) that does not exceed £16,190
- If you are supported under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after your employment finishes or after you start to work fewer hours per week
- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400 (£616.67 per month), as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).

To check if your child is eligible, apply online for an immediate response or call 0345 606 6067 for advice.
