It is good for children to socialise with other children.

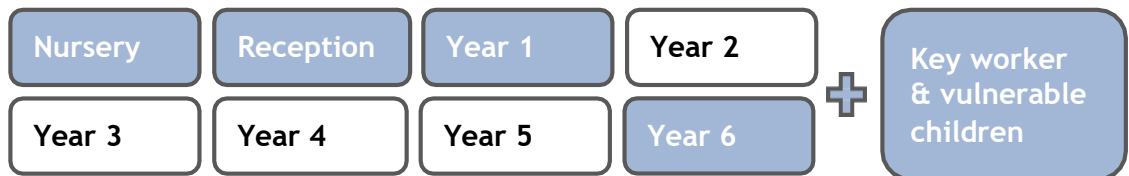


School is the best place for them to learn.

June 3rd



From June 3rd we will welcome back children, but only from Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and year 6. School will still be open for key workers' children and vulnerable children.

What about their brothers and sisters?



Only children in the year groups above.



Children in years 2 - 5 need to stay at home

How are you making sure school is safe?



We will check for risks before school is open.



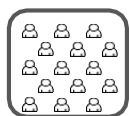
Everyone will wash their hands regularly.

If your child is well and in one of the groups asked to attend they should.



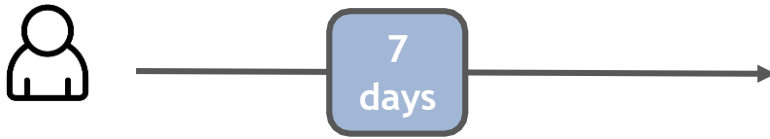
There will be no fines if your child does not go to school.

Will my child be tested ?

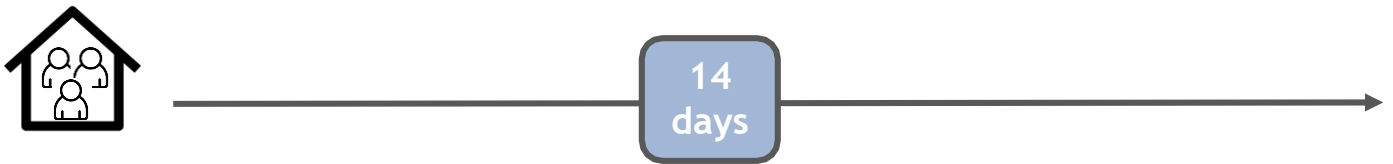


Yes, if your child shows symptoms of Coronavirus they will be tested.

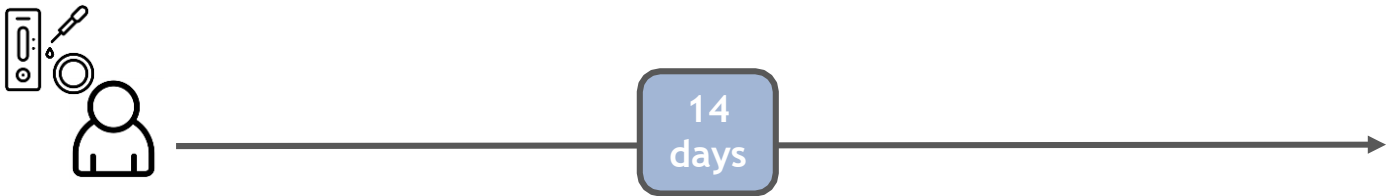
What if there is a case of Coronavirus in school?



The person with symptoms must self isolate for 7 days.



The people they live with must self isolate for 14 days.



If anyone at school tests positive, the whole class must self isolate for 14 days.

What else might change?



The time you drop off and pick up your child.



Your child may have a different classroom & teacher.



They may not have all their normal lessons.



We will change how we serve lunch.

Additional Information

- Years Nursery, Reception, 1 and 6 are invited back to school and expected to attend for all sessions. Parents will not be fined if they do not send their children to school.
- We will ensure a regular and thorough use of handwashing for all children and staff throughout the day.
- Children attending school will remain in the same small group (no more than 10) at all times.
- Temperature checks of children cannot be taken by the school.
- Face coverings will not be worn by either staff or children in school.
- Social distancing within small groups cannot be expected.
- Children may not be in a small group with their usual teacher or friends of choice.
- Siblings of children in returning year groups will not be admitted to school.
- There will be strict rules about parental access to the site - your school will give you further details. Parents will be expected to socially distance when dropping off/collecting.
- Critical worker and vulnerable children currently in school will be placed in groups within their year (Nursery, Reception, Y1, Y6). All other critical worker and vulnerable children will remain in their original group.
- No hot food will be provided, only a packed lunch for Reception and Y1, in accordance with universal infant free school meals guidance. Packed lunches will be purchasable for Nursery and Y6 children through Parentmail at £2.30 per meal.
Parents choosing to send a packed lunch should send it in a bag which will be disposed of after eating.
